LAW INNOVATION SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY

The Faculty of Law of Université de Montréal is launching a new doctoral option called, Law and Innovation, Science & Technology.

Drawing on seasoned Faculty members and well-known partners, the doctoral option targets students wishing to develop expertise in the role that law plays in the promotion, governance and framing of innovation, science and technology – all of which in a comparative law perspective that is alert to the realities of emerging markets.

A SOLID EDUCATION OFFERING AN EXTENSIVE RANGE OF COURSES

The doctoral option takes the form of a selection of courses allowing students to reflect on legal, regulatory and ethical aspects of innovation, science and technology in various domains such as biotechnology and health sciences, information technology, natural resources and the environment.

AN APPROACH THAT IS BOTH THEORETICAL AND APPLIED

Both theoretical and applied teaching take place thanks to the participation of high-calibre professors and professionals. Students furthermore have the opportunity of undertaking an internship with public and private organizations in Canada and abroad.

INTERNATIONALIZATION AND COMPARATIVE LAW

Thanks to the support of its foreign partners, as well as the international network of the Faculty of Law, the doctoral option bears internationalization and comparative law as its very brand. An international summer school is organized annually for the program's students at one of our partner institutions. Professors visiting from abroad furthermore enhance the program's comparative law dimension.

TRANSFORMING A THESIS INTO A CAREER

Solid coursework in combination with the writing of a doctoral thesis enhance students' career prospects, be they to undertake an academic career as researcher, professor or consultant, or as expert within a private or public organization.
